Dear Parent/Guardian,

Enclosed are the results of your child's winter STAR Assessments. These results are only one snapshot of your child's development and growth in the areas of math and literacy. The teacher's daily observations and interactions with your child provide the most comprehensive overview of how your child is learning/developing. These computer-adaptive assessments are quick, valid and reliable, and provide instructional information to your child's teacher(s).

What are STAR assessments?

STAR Assessments include STAR Early Literacy, STAR Reading and STAR Math.

What are the questions like?

Here are some sample items for each test:

What does each assessment measure?

STAR Early Literacy measures skills developed for Pre-K–3 students. STAR Early Literacy tracks development in three domains:

- Word Facility and Skills
- Comprehension Strategies and Constructing Meaning
- Numbers and Operations

STAR Reading is an assessment of reading comprehension and skills for independent readers through grade 12. STAR Reading tracks development in five domains:

- Word Knowledge and Skills
- Comprehension Strategies and Constructing Meaning
- Analyzing Literary Text
- Understanding Author's Craft
- Analyzing Argument and Evaluating Text

STAR Math is an assessment of math achievement for students in grades 1–12. STAR Math tracks development in four domains:

- Numbers and Operations
- Algebra
- Geometry and Measurement
- Data Analysis, Statistics, and Probability

What kind of score does my child get?

For the STAR Reading and Math assessments, you will see a percentile rank (PR) score. The Percentile Rank score compares your child's test performance with that of other students nationally in the same grade. For example, a PR of 50 would mean that your child's skills in the tested area are greater than 50% of students nationally in the same grade. The PR Range indicates that, if your child had taken a STAR test numerous times, most of his/her scores would likely have fallen within this range.

For the STAR Early Literacy and STAR Math assessments, you will also see a scaled score (SS), which is based on the difficulty of the questions and the number of correct answers. Scaled scores are useful for comparing your child's performance over time and across grades. STAR Math scaled scores range from 0–1400. STAR Early Literacy scaled scores range from 300–900.

It is important to realize that STAR assessments do NOT include any feedback on the development of the following skills and character attributes, which are equally as important to success in life:



Our two co-ed youth leagues cover boys and girls from 1st through 4th grade.
